From Pastor David:

Dear Saints of St. Peter's:

Our granddaughter, Violet, has begun taking steps for the past few weeks. We were delighted to watch a video on our phones as she took a few steps. She grinned and was clearly proud of herself---"look at me, I'm walking."

Since taking her first steps, we had her overnight and we discovered she will walk when she wants to walk. Sometimes, when I tried to encourage and help her walk, she would simply sit down on the floor and crawl. She resorted to what she could do more easily.

We had a picnic on a blanket in our backyard with Violet. She loved sitting on the blanket, but she would not leave the blanket. She did not like the feel of grass.

On February 17 (Ash Wednesday) we took a baby step back to worshiping in person. In March 2020, following the CDC's recommendations, we suspended in person worship. Since Ash Wednesday, we have followed the CDC's guidelines which include wearing masks and distancing. For the past month, in accordance with CDC's guidelines, our guilters and some circles have met without masks as they have all been fully vaccinated.

We are all weary of the restrictions that the pandemic demanded, and we are all eager to return to gathering with our friends and family once again.

The CDC recently announced that fully vaccinated people "can resume activities you did prior to the pandemic." We have decided to again follow the CDC's recommendations. Therefore, if you are fully vaccinated you may worship without a mask. If you are not yet vaccinated, we recommend that you wear a mask and get vaccinated. Of course, all people are free to wear a mask if they desire to do so.

We will all need to practice patience and grace with ourselves and our neighbors in the coming months. Just because Violet can walk from point A to point B, doesn't mean she will. She'll walk when she wants to and when she's ready.

The same is and will be true for us as a Christian community as we gather in-person and online for worship, fellowship, nurture, and education. We may need to encourage our siblings in Christ while at other times be encouraged. We may need to support our brothers/sisters in Christ while at other times be supported. We will all need to be patient with each other and ourselves.

I am excited for and intrigued by what the coming months will hold for us. However the summer unfolds, we are God's beloved children, abiding in Christ's love, and bearing fruit for the Kingdom of God.



REMEMBERING FORMER PASTOR NIELSEN



John Wolter Nielsen, June 29, 1925 – May 12, 2021, was the pastor during the construction of our current St. Peter's church building. He passed away earlier this month. See his full obituary at albertleatribune.com. **Excerpts:**

John was born June 29, 1925 in Mankato, Minnesota to John

Nielsen, an immigrant from the west coast of Denmark, and Mette Wolter Nielsen, who was born to German immigrant parents in rural Martin County, Minnesota. On April 8, 1949, he was united in marriage at First Lutheran Church in Blair to Elizabeth Hansen Solevad of Watsonville, California, whose parents were also Danish immigrants.

Church and school shaped his life. After attending a oneroom school for eight grades, he attended and graduated from Albert Lea High School in 1943 and received his BA in English from Dana College in 1947. He taught juniorsenior English for two years in Stanton, Nebraska before attending the University of California – Berkeley. While there he felt the call to enter the ministry, and so returned to Trinity Seminary in Blair where he received his BD in 1953. Following his ordination, he served St. Peter's Lutheran Church in Northfield, Minnesota.

In 1962 he accepted the call to be Dana College's first campus pastor and a professor of religion. In 1968, he

matriculated at Oxford University in Great Britain, where he received his D.Phil. in June, 1976.

Always interested in the importance of collecting archival materials – letters, journals, and diaries – for documenting the history of everyday individuals, he initiated and directed a reorganization of institutional archival holdings that, following the closing of Dana College in 2010, became the Danish American Archive and Library. He served as its director until 2011 when he was named Executive Director Emeritus.

My story started out very normal. I had a career as an RN. This career afforded me the opportunity to travel throughout state working in healthcare facilities. I loved my family and job. Fast forward, my kids grew up and moved out, and then came the divorce. It was a difficult time for me, and even though the divorce was amicable, I started drinking.



I met my boyfriend and drinking became a way of life. We had been together for two years and I had learned early on that drinking led to altercations. But one fight changed my life forever. It started as any other argument but escalated to violence quickly. A sympathetic doctor later explained that I had a brain bleed and broken bones in my face from the brutal beating I had endured. I was left with a traumatic brain injury that is now my reality. I was terrified. I decided to go to treatment.

My boyfriend kicked me out, leaving me to live in my car. I entered a treatment center and successfully completing my program. Unfortunately, I found myself without a home and unable to work because of my traumatic brain injury.

I found Sarah's House, and it sparked renewed hope. My caseworker and I addressed my individual recovery needs and Sarah's House offered the space to transition from inpatient treatment to living in my community. Less than three months later, I found my own apartment and have the tools and resources needed to embrace my new beginning. *name changed

Janet Gutzmann (1/21/1933 -3/26/2020) was born in Melrose, MA. After her mother died when Janet was about age 4, her father moved back to his home state of Minnesota. They settled in West St. Paul near Janet's aunt and uncle who helped care for Janet and her elder brother. Janet's ancestors came from Sweden to homestead near Millersburg, MN. Janet's great-grandfather was a founding member of Christdala Church, constructed in 1878 in Millersburg by Swedish immigrants after a young man in their community was murdered during the raid on the bank in Northfield by the

James and Younger gangs.

As a teenager, Janet dreamed of becoming a missionary. Her desire to serve the Lord was shared by George Gutzmann. George's intention to enter the ministry was one of the reasons that Janet accepted his proposal of marriage. George took a winding road that eventually led to Luther Seminary in St. Paul, MN. He became an ordained Lutheran minister in 1970. Janet was his partner in ministry, particularly in planning and implementing programs for the women and children in the five parishes in which they served. After George retired, they moved from Great Falls, MT back home to Minnesota. They chose to settle in Northfield to be near their many friends and family members who lived in the area.

St. Peter's Lutheran Church seemed to be an ideal church home in the last phase of their lives. Through their membership in the community of believers at St. Peter's, cherished friendships were formed that enriched the remainder of their lives. It was an inviting place to worship with other believers; a place to deepen their faith; a place to explore the scriptures and a place to share their faith.

Janet became involved in a variety of areas of ministry at St. Peter's. In 1996, Janet became a member of the first Congregational Life Board which included Bruce and Kristin Dennison, Colleen Meyer, Pete Pedersen and Pat Picha. In August 1996, Janet was sent by St. Peter's Lutheran Church to Baltimore, MD to participate in a training for Christ Care Equippers, a new program in the ELCA. Janet shared what she had learned with other Christ Care Equippers at St. Peter's including Jane Albers, Whitey Aus,

Lynn Cybysae, Bruce and Kristin Dennison, Pete Pedersen and Dottie Scharber.

Janet felt a strong connection with and a commitment to her church family at St. Peter's. Even after selling her home and moving to Northfield Retirement Community (NRC,) Janet maintained her membership at St. Peter's Lutheran Church. She attended

services there as often as she could. She was also pleased to have the opportunity to worship at the chapel at NRC when her health or the weather prevented her from making the drive to St. Peter's. She, along with other residents at NRC who were members at St. Peter's, enjoyed monthly luncheons hosted at NRC by Pastor David Weeks.

One of her last acts of service at St. Peter's was to deliver a sermonette at a Lenten service in 2018. In her message, she stated, "We gather as a community and taste the Bread of Life. When we come together to share Holy Communion, we become whole, complete and filled with the Power to reach beyond borders."

As her family, we are grateful to have the support and assistance of her church family at St. Peter's Lutheran Church in the celebration of Janet's life. We take comfort in the assurance that she is now in her true home.

We then broke into three groups to begin discussion of the focus areas we had identified last year. The focus areas are Youth, Stewardship, and Newcomers. - Programming, how much money do we need to accomplish that

Newcomers:

- Discussed need to be a "presence" in the community.
- Discussed using various media outlets to advertise our presence.

We began our regular business meeting following this discussion. The following items were discussed:

- Next year we are ordering new **offering envelopes** that will be sent to members regularly through the mail.
- The Outreach Committee intends to host regular free dinners to newcomers to Northfield for the purpose of answering questions and introducing them to other newcomers. We are applying for an Open Doors Grant from the ELCA to assist with seed money. The grant is being given through random computer selection.



- Time and Talent Sheets will be distributed in the mail as well as in the newsletter. Expect them within the next month.
- We discussed recruiting leaders to fill positions on our Committees.
- Julie Klock will be taking a sabbatical this summer in June and July. Annalissa will cover youth activities during her absence.
- Tom reported that **April offerings** were again positive.
- We discussed the difficulty with obtaining insurance coverage for the middle school room and flat roof repair. Since this has been ongoing for around 3 years, it was decided we will ask for legal assistance.
- We are continuing to work on facility use. We need to check the insurance and liability for room usage both long term and single usage
- In-person church attendance continues at 30-50 attendees per week. We will wait for further instruction from the state and CDC as to increasing numbers, removing masks and singing.
- Julie Klock, Steve Hill and Pastor David attended the Southeast Minnesota Synod Assembly via Zoom.


The group closed with the Lord's Prayer.
