From **Pastor David**

Dear Saints of St. Peter's,

"You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in you." - St. Augustine

A relationship with, and an experience of God is our deepest longing. We long for God's love and grace. We desire God's peace. We know ourselves to be out of touch or distanced from God, and we yearn to be in communion with God.

For many of us, Lent is the season when we especially focus on our relationship with God. It is a time of reflection, reorientation, and renewal. We're beginning to sense that spring is around the corner, and just as spring sprouts new life, so we desire new spiritual growth. Psalm 51:10 encapsulates Lent: "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me."

No one lives a pain-free life. We all experience disappointment and failure. We make mistakes. And, our dreams fail to materialize. Again from Psalm 51, "my sin is ever before me." We recognize that we have drifted

away from God, and we seek God's presence. Lent is a time to reboot.

I invite you to utilize a number of spiritual practices this season of Lent. First off, make worship a priority. We worship on Sunday mornings at 9:00 and Wednesday evenings at 6:15. The theme for our Wednesday evening Lenten worship services is "Perfect Love Casts Out Fear."

Throughout the Bible, God greets people—Moses, Mary, shepherds, Peter—with "Do not be afraid." We are afraid of many things—diseases, natural disasters, climate change, immigrants, financial collapse.... And the Gospel promise is that God is with us.

On Ash Wednesday (March 6) we are marked with a cross with the reminder that we are dust and to dust we shall return.

We also have a small 2019 Lenten devotional, *Lasting Hope*, with daily devotions based on the Psalms from Ash Wednesday through Easter morning. The Psalms are some of the finest words in scripture to read devotionally as they honestly express our hopes, dreams, fears, and failures. Our Sunday services will utilize this devotional. See article on page 5.

Finally, I invite you to consider going on a 40-Day Journey with Parker Palmer. Palmer is a contemporary contemplative Christian within the Quaker tradition. He is also a Carleton graduate. Each day's reading has a short reading from Palmer along with a biblical text, a psalm fragment, questions to reflect upon, and an invitation to both journal and meditate in silence. We have a dozen copies. Beth Vivant and I are working on scheduling opportunities for those participating in this 40-Day Journey to gather together and share their experiences with others.

It requires intentionality and time to tend to our relationship with God. In a world where our worth is measured by how busy we are, I invite you to slow down, breathe deeply, and be filled with Jesus' love and grace. Our restless hearts will not rest till they rest in God, nor will God rest till God resides in our hearts.

*May Christ bring you peace,
renewal, hope, and new life.*

"Now is the winter of our discontent"

As I sit here at home watching it snow on yet another Wednesday, the 3rd of the last 4 Wednesday nights with church cancelled, this quote from Shakespeare's Richard III seems apropos.

"Now is the winter of our discontent." One explanation of this quote is that we have reached the depth of our unhappiness and that better times are ahead! I can't help but parallel this thought as we Christians are about to begin our journey through Lent.

There is a Lenten hymn I would like you to take a look at from our hymnal. The text and music are written by Marty Haugen, who hails from Wanamingo, MN. The hymn is titled, *Tree of Life and Awesome Mystery* (ELW#334).

Tree of Life and Awesome Mystery

1 Tree of Life and awesome myst'ry,
in your death we are reborn;
though you die in all of hist'ry,
still you rise with ev'ry morn,
still you rise with ev'ry morn.

2 We remember truth once spoken,
love passed on through act and word;
ev'ry person lost and broken
wears the body of our Lord,
wears the body of our Lord.

3 Christ, you lead and we shall follow,
stumbling though our steps may be;
one with you in joy and sorrow,
we the river, you the sea,
we the river, you the sea.

For each week of Lent, Haugen offers a varying fourth verse:

Lent 1

From the dawning of creation
you have loved us as your own;
stay with us through all temptation,
make us turn to you alone.

Lent 2

In our call to be a blessing,
may we be a blessing true;
may we live and die confessing
Christ as Lord of all we do.

Lent 3

Living Water of salvation,
be the fountain of each soul;
springing up in new creation,
flow in us and make us whole.

Lent 4

Give us eyes to see you clearly;
make us children of your light.
Give us hearts to live more nearly
as your gospel shining bright.

Lent 5

God of all our fear and sorrow,
God who lives beyond our death,
hold us close through each tomorrow,
love as near as ev'ry breath.

Council Highlights

February 18, 2019 • 7:00 p.m.

Present: Bougie, C. Hill, S. Hill, Kleppe, Lee, Picha, Sillanpa, Weeks

Agenda: adoption of the Agenda

Introductions: New members of the Church Council were welcomed and the group participated in activities to help learn about one another (meaning behind your name, introduce your partner).

Devotions: Pastor David read a story from Exodus about Moses and the burning bush.

Meeting Minutes from January 15 were approved.

Reports:

- **New Council Secretary:** Amy Sillanpa was voted in as secretary (nominated by Kleppe and seconded by Lee – all voted yes).
- **Sunday services:** The Council had a discussion about the change to one service at 9am and whether to continue with one service or return to two services. Ultimately due to the low attendance at the 10:45am service most Sundays, the Council determined that it would be in the best interest of the congregation to continue with one service on Sundays. Pastor David explained that congregations typically consider adding an additional service when 85% of the church is full. Unfortunately we are not seeing that type of attendance on Sundays. The Council also discussed whether the 9am start time was the best time to start. After discussing alternative ideas, the Council determined that 9am is the best time to have the church service. (Motion to keep the one service schedule at 9am was made by Lee and second by Bougie – all voted yes.)
- **Sunday School start time:** The idea of having a 10 minute transition time in between the church service and the start of Sunday School was brought up by Sillanpa. Teachers and kids who attend church need a little time to get to Sunday School so they don't have to leave before the service ends. Kids who don't attend church are showing up before teachers are able to get to the classroom. Kids who attend church are showing up late for the 10am start time. Pastor David will talk to Julie about start time of Sunday School and let her decide what will work best.
- **Sabbatical Leave Policy:** The Synod recommends congregations offer their Pastors sabbaticals. St. Peter's Lutheran Church follows this recommendation but does not have a written policy. We will request other congregation's sabbatical policies in order to write our own. This will be put on the March agenda.
- **Church Refurbishing project:** The Council had a discussion about the request to provide cushions in the pews. Various options were discussed. The Council determined that individual cushions would be sufficient (Motion to move forward with individual cushions and for the CRC committee to take care of it was made by Kleppe and Lee seconded it – all voted yes.)
- **Council retreat:** The Council will be going on their annual retreat in March. The Council chose March 16 at Mount Olivet. Members should meet at 8am at St. Peter's Church to car-pool there together. The retreat is scheduled for 9am-3pm. Main agenda item will be to determine how best to cover things while Pastor David is on sabbatical.
- **Offering pick up schedule:** The Council passed around a sign up to for depositing church offering into the safe on Sundays.
