#### From **Pastor David**

Dear Friends in Christ,

The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit. John 3:8.

The Bible begins by announcing that in the beginning the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, "while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters." NRSV. Some translations read the "breath of God" while others say "spirit of God." Each translation is correct but insufficient. The Hebrew word ruach means wind/breath/spirt. In English, the translator must choose one.

June 9 is Pentecost Sunday when we celebrate God's sending the Holy Spirit upon Jesus' followers and creating the Church. In Acts 2, the arrival of the Spirit sounded like the sound of a violent wind. In the Gospel of John, when Jesus appeared to his disciples after his resurrection, he breathed on them.

Wind is nothing more than the perceptible movement of air from one place to another. So long as there is wind, there is life.

God's creation of both the world and the church is an ongoing process. God did not create life on planet earth 3.5 billion years ago and then quit creating. Nor did God just create the Church, or fellowship of believers.

The wind is certainly a factor when out on group bike rides. It takes a lot more effort to head straight into the wind, while a gusty side wind can push you around considerably. A tailwind is always welcome

as it takes considerably less effort.

Today's Church is not the Church in which I grew up. I will admit and acknowledge that I miss some things about my childhood church. I'm also grateful that some things have changed. It's a good thing that some attitudes and behaviors have died and it's a good thing that new opportunities have sprouted and taken root.

Many Christians (self-included) have expressed concern about changes in Christ's Church, i.e., declining worship attendance, decreasing revenue, busier personal schedules, etc. What if our worries are nothing more than our riding into God's Spirit? What if our concerns about changes and losses are in fact a fighting against God's wind/breath/spirit? As I stated in the first sentence of this paragraph, the Church is Christ's—not mine nor yours—and God continues to breathe life into God's people.

It's spring. All the new growth in our gardens, fields, and yards are feasting on last year's death. "Death is something empires worry about, not something gardeners worry about," Rachel Held Evans. Could it be that we as Christians have misunderstood our calling—while we thought God was calling us to build an empire, our true calling is to be gardeners?

As followers of Jesus, we are in the death and resurrection business. As followers of Jesus, we know that when and where there is wind, there is life. In the coming Pentecost season, I invite you to note and give thanks for God's Spirit of love and mercy which has always and will always shape and give life to the world which God loves.

The ELCA Young Adults in Global Mission program (YAGM) invites ELCA young adults ages 21-29 into a yearlong journey in international service. The program asks young adults to become the hands and feet of Jesus in the world, providing critical support to ministries and projects in communities of need. Current YAGM country programs include: Argentina/Uruguay, Australia, Cambodia, Central Europe, Jerusalem/West Bank, Madagascar, Mexico, Rwanda, Senegal, Southern Africa and United Kingdom.

Maddi Froiland, who has served as one of St. Peter's Youth Interns for the past two years, has been selected for this program. She will be sent to Jerusalem/West Bank beginning in August. It costs roughly \$15,000 to send one YAGM to their country program. Through the generosity of the ELCA, \$10,000 of this is already covered. Maddi needs to raise the remaining \$5,000. The bells will play their last selections of the season on Sunday. So often we think of summer as our kids do – it's break time! But... don't forget, that worship continues. What a fortunate opportunity to be able to attend church year-round. We don't need to wait 3 months before being seen again amongst other believers in the pews!

What I have enjoyed through the years of vacationing in the summer months, is to check out how churches elsewhere "do" worship! ## A Difficult Topic Important to So Many: ELCA's Social Statement on Abortion

In 1973, the Supreme Court of the United States ruled that state laws that banned abortion were unconstitutional. Though this ruling was 46 years ago, the debate remains alive and deeply emotional. In the last few years, court appointees have given hope to some and fear to others that Roe vs Wade will be overturned. In the last couple of months, a few states have passed more restrictive laws, thus setting up a challenge to the Supreme Court's 1973 ruling.

Faithful, committed Christians are active and passionate on both sides of this issue. In 1991, the ELCA adopted a Social Statement on Abortion which seeks to frame the conversation differently than pitting the rights of the fetus with the rights of the mother.

We are well aware that this is a difficult and emotion-packed conversation. All of us disagree on this issue with people we love and respect. Some might think it would be wiser for us to not discuss difficult and challenging topics in the church as it might make waves. However, we believe the church should not shy away from difficult topics. We take our cue from Jesus who constantly challenged the status quo and made uncomfortable those who were comfortable in their own self-righteousness.

"This church encourages its members to participate in the public debate on abortion in a spirit of respect for those with whom they differ. Committed to a process of raising and deliberating the difficult and unresolved questions, this church encourages it members, informed by faith understandings and by their conscience, to decide and act on this issue in ways that are responsive to God and to the needs of the neighbor." ELCA Social Statement on Abortion.

On July 21 & 28, we will have a conversation about abortion, using the ELCA's Social Statement to frame our conversation. The conversation will be in the Fireside Room after worship.

## Endowment Fund Update

#### FORMED:

The Mission Endowment fund was established and adopted by the Congregation Council on January 29, 1994.

#### **PURPOSE:**

The purpose of the Mission Endowment Fud, and the committee/team that manages the fund, is to enhance the work of St. Peter's Church by establishing new stewardship opportunities through planned and deferred giving strategies. These strategies are in addition to the General Operating Budget. The committee/team is responsible for investing and managing the accumulated resources.

#### DISTRIBUTION OF INCOME:

Gifts and bequests to the fund shall accumulate with principle invested, and the income generated from the investment of the principle shall be expended.

#### **STATUS:**

As of March 31, 2019, the principle of this St. Peter's Endowment Fund was \$257,624. Our fund along with other ELCA congregational endowment funds are administered by the ELCA headquarters through an investment firm. The income generated from our St. Peter's fund is available for investments in:

- 1. Outreach into the community and synod
- 2. Missions of the ELCA
- 3. Capital improvements, debt reduction, and building programs

Our St. Peter's gifts and bequests to our Endowment Fund in the last few years has been very minimal. We need to rededicate ourselves to further build this Endowment Fund for our St. Peter's future opportunities, needs, and financial security. Our goal for principle is \$500,000, or more, by 2025.

#### **GIVING OPTIONS:**

- A. Your will after providing for you loved ones, St. Peter's can be named as a beneficiary. Choose a certain dollar amount or property.
- B. A living revocable trust St. Peter's can be named as a beneficiary. Choose a certain dollar amount or property.
- C. Your insurance program name St. Peter's as a beneficiary for a percentage of the policy or create a policy just for St. Peter's.
- D. Cash gift in honor or memory of someone.
- E. Stock gift of appreciated stock to avoid taxes on capital gains.
- F. IRA gift if 70.5 years of age, gifts made from your IRA (up to \$100,000/yr) are not reportable as taxable income. IRA Charitable Rollover Gifts also qualify for your required minimum distribution which can lower your income and taxes.
