Dear Saints of St. Peter's

November begins with All Saints Day. It is a celebration of a messy organization we know as Church.

On All Saints Sunday we typically give thanks to God for the people in our lives through whom the light of Christ has shined. We remember parents, grandparents, siblings, Sunday School teachers, pastors, etc.

On November 3, we will again provide you the opportunity to light a candle in memory/honor of a saint who has radiated Jesus' love for you. We remember Jesus' words which we repeat at baptism: "Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven."

All Saints Sunday reminds us that following Jesus is a communal activity. None of us became a Christian and none of us lives as a Christian apart from the community. We need others for support and encouragement, and others need us for support and encouragement.

When we give thanks to God for the saints in our lives, I suspect we all tend to focus on those with whom life is easy. What if we were more intentional about including in our All Saints' thanksgiving, people who make life difficult for us? What if we were more honest about own brokenness and God's equal love for people with whom we disagree? What if we focused on our shared brokenness, confusion, and disillusionment? What if we remembered and embraced that we are just as messed up as those we believe to be messed up?

Jesus' Kingdom parables reveal that God's love and grace are found where we least expect it. In Jesus' parables, it is in the least that God's love is revealed and it is the outsider who does God's will. More often than we care to admit. God's love and grace are revealed in the words and actions of the very people we exclude and dismiss.

As we remember the saints of Jesus Christ, may God grant us strength to be honest about our own shortcomings and Jesus' amazing grace that invites, welcomes and includes us all.


### Restroom #Progress Report

# Music Notes

We are almost to the end of another church year. Christ the King Sunday (November 24) is considered the last Sunday of our church year. Advent kicks off a new church year – quite appropriate, as Advent literally means, "the arrival of a notable person, thing, or event." The four Sundays of Advent prepare us for the arrival of the most notable person in world history. The coming of our Savior.

Advent is a fun, yet difficult, season to plan worship. There are so many wonderful hymns! Hymn-singing is a big part of my life. I learned to sing hymns at an early age. My dad was a pastor at a large church in West Allis, Wisconsin during those years. There was an active Senior Citizens group at the church that apparently enjoyed when mom, also a church music director, would bring me to their gatherings to "sing for them." Later, in my school years, my mom followed her mother's tradition, which was to give a monetary award for each hymn I could play – all voice parts - without stopping!

I grew up singing harmonies to hymns. My mother would often whisper in my ear during a hymn at worship, "sing tenor

on the next stanza" or "try the bass line up an octave" (didn't every mother do that?!!!). The tradition of reading music is heightened through singing hymns. As a lifelong music educator, I of course strongly support reading music. Blogger Tim Challies says, "Hymns were most often written so they could be sung a cappella or with minimal instrumentation. For that reason, hymnals almost invariably included the music for both melody and harmonies and congregations learned to sing the parts."

I love learning new, singable, worship songs both in our hymnal as well as found elsewhere. I appreciate being able to see them in full – melody and harmony – to fully praise, prayerfully sing, and proudly proclaim my faith.

"Make a joyful noise unto the Lord, all ye lands. Serve the Lord with gladness; come before his presence with singing." Psalm 100:1-2

### Fighting Hunger One Pie at a Time

Many thanks to all the members of St. Peter's who preordered a \$12 homemade Swedish Apple Pie. You have helped feed the hungry of Northfield. Using a grant from Thrivent for the ingredients, including perfectly ripe Zestar apples, our volunteers made 50 of the yummy Swedish Apple Pies. The finished pies went off to the walk-in freezer at Family Fare, and were delivered as ordered during the coffee after the service on Sunday, October 6. The frozen pies can be baked in a 350 degree oven for 60 minutes for a wonderfully easy dessert (especially when you add vanilla ice cream). Because folks who have managed the annual Crop Walk in Northfield were unable to run it this year, this year's local Crop Walk was canceled, and we had to give our donation somewhere else. Our volunteers voted unanimously to lessen hunger in Northfield by donating all the money we made to CAC's Food Bank. The amount was more than the \$600 for the 50 pies as some gave additional donations.

The Food Bank was pleased to receive the unused Zestar apples too. They went directly into the fresh produce section to fill that empty apple bin. If you have extra garden produce or find

you have too many unopened bags of flour or sugar, cans, bottles, or spices, chips or breads, or other items found in a grocery, here is how to donate to the Food Bank. Circle to the east side of the 50North building, go past the door for customers, to the door for donations. There is room to park one car and one truck at a time.

Ring the doorbell beside that donation door, and wait for those inside to let you in. They'll mark the name of the gift giver and the gift on their clipboard, and that's it. No fuss; no lengthy paperwork.

October 8, 2019 • 7:00 p.m.

**Present:** Bougie, C. Hill, S. Hill, Lee, Picha, Sillanpa, Weeks, and Ziegler

**Approval of the Agenda:** Ziegler added pew pads to the agenda; the agenda was approved by all.

**Devotions & Book Discussion:** The devotion was led by Pastor David on Chapter 5 of The Mission Table and Luke 24 about the road to Emmaus. The council had a discussion.

**Approval of Minutes:** A motion to approve the minutes was made by C Hill and seconded by Bougie – all voted yes.

### **Staff Reports:**

- Pastor David Weeks provided a report. Some of the highlights include: blessing of the pets took place, with a turtle being the most unique pet this year; confirmation is going well; 2nd Sunday of October a community connection conversation will take place on what it means to be a sanctuary denomination from a faith perspective being loving and caring of all neighbors; Eucharistic ministry starts Oct 20; and no crop walk is happening this year.
- Julie Klock prepared a written report to distribute to the council. Some of the highlights include: Sunday School started with Rally Sunday; the kids sang in church Oct 6; the youth interns are planning a scary movie night for Saturday Oct 26; the kick-off confirmation event went well; confirmation students are registered for the January classes.

**Treasurer's Report:** Picha provided a financial report. The council discussed that giving is down. If congregation members are interested in signing up for Vanco, which is an automatic withdrawal that makes regular giving easy, there is a form that can be filled out and submitted to Dennis.

**Sabbatical Leave Policy:** Tabled until next meeting.

**Project Updates:** The balcony floor and sanctuary floor have been fixed. The bathroom project is going well and should be done soon.

**Parsonage:** We most likely will work with Ruth's House to provide housing to families in need. Working on getting the home ready – still some interior work to do so will be reaching out to the congregation for help. Picha will work on determining date(s).

**Capital Planning:** A special meeting for this project will take place on October 15, 7pm. In addition to council members, the following people will be invited because of their expertise in various aspects of the building: Troy Nystuen, Phil Olson, Paul Wegner, Steve Schmidt, Brian Kopack, Steve Harner, and Eric Randall. Others are welcome to attend.

- The council discussed the need to do repairs and paint the Middle School Classroom.

**Endowment Fund**: Pastor Weeks distributed a donor commitment form that could be updated for St. Peter's. A presentation by Theron Leopold on wills/estates and the Mission Endowment Fund will happen on Oct 27.

**Substituting Pastors:** The council discussed how to handle visitations while Pastor Weeks is gone on sabbatical.

**Pew Pads:** Discussed what the pew pads are used for. Pastor Weeks said they help identify visitors so we can reach out to them.

**Closing:** Meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 8:15pm


